## Over \$330,000 invested to boost technology in the regions

- Government grants program invests over \$330,000 to boost technology and innovation capabilities for Western Australian Community Resource Network
- \$334,034 awarded to 44 Community Resource Centre projects
- Dumbleyung, Lake Grace, Newdegate, Wagin, West Arthur and Williams Community Resource Centres all to receive funding

Rural and remote communities across Western Australia will benefit from the WA Labor State Government funding towards technology projects to improve community services.

More than \$330,000 has been awarded to support 44 Community Resource Centres (CRC) to implement technology and innovation projects across the regions.

#### Funding will allow the:

- Williams CRC to purchase video equipment to use for an oral and visual history project
- West Arthur CRC to purchase a widescreen laptop for Telehealth appointments and upgrade the conference room facilities
- Wagin CRC to purchase a Smartscreen camera and speakers
- Newdegate CRC to improve video conference facilities
- Lake Grace CRC to purchase a Smartscreen camera and speakers
- Dumbleyung CRC to replace four computers

The WA Community Resource Network has more than 100 CRCs across regional and remote areas of the State, with all CRCs eligible to apply under the grant program.

The program provides grants of up to \$10,000 per CRC and is administered by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.
