Agricultural region celebrates upgrades for local sport facilities.

- Cook Labor Government's Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund (CSRFF) and Club Nights Lights Program (CNLP) grant recipients announced
- More than \$24.2 million in total for upgrades to facilities and lighting across the state
- Shire of Dumbleyung and Shire of Katanning are among the successful recipients

The Shire of Dumbleyung and the Shire of Katanning have been awarded a grant through the Cook Labor Government's Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund.

The Shire of Dumbleyung received \$1,600,00 for the reconstruction of Dumbleyung Swimming Pool

The Shire of Katanning received \$1,207,000 for the reconstruction of oval surface and installation of 5 new poles with LED floodlighting at Quartermaine Oval.

Across the state, more than \$20 million is being delivered to 24 facility improvement projects through CSRFF, as well as \$3.4 million to 11 projects through CNLP for upgrading lighting or installing new floodlights.

The small grants program enables community organisations, local governments and sport and recreation clubs to apply for and receive funds to support the development of highquality infrastructure and environments for sport and recreation activities.
